With a view to provide the better avenues of learning, Smt. Manjira Devi University organizes from time to time, the public interest seminar and invites distinguished persons to address the students. The University draws 20% Faculties from industries who carries the practical Experience, which is imparted to the students. In addition to above, the University encourages and supports student managed clubs for extramural activities by the students aimed at developing the overall personality of the students.
